GARBAGE CANS - A REMINDER



Over the past few weeks, we have gotten complaints about residents leaving their garbage cans out on the road for several days at a time. This is a particular concern along Hollow Rd. and other areas of the City where there is not curb and gutter and where the road bends and curves. In these areas, drivers are not always able to see in front of them for long distances. Any obstruction in the roadway, including garbage cans, increases the potential for an accident.

As a reminder, all residents are required to remove their garbage cans from the road the same day as the garbage is collected. Please be considerate of your neighbors and take the few minutes to do this each week.

The Nibley City Tree Board met for the first time last month and discussed many tree beautification projects. They are working on an Arbor celebration that will take place in April. The primary focus of the committee is to remind everyone of the tremendous value of trees in our lives. Besides the obvious benefits of lumber for our homes and businesses, trees replenish the oxygen in the atmosphere, provide homes for creeping things and fowl, and beautify our neighborhoods. The tree board will keep you updated on their many projects. I continue to receive requests from residents to assist in these efforts. I appreciate your willingness to better our community.

The Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan is nearing completion. The planning phase has been a big project and the construction phase will be a 20 year project. I am very excited about what it means for Nibley City over the next two decades. We plan to build a large park complex (50+ acres), while upgrading our current smaller parks, all without raising taxes. The large complex is needed to accommodate our growth and will mostly be funded by impact fees. I appreciate the City Council and City staff that have put so much time into creating this wonderful plan.

Here is an update on the major facility improvements to the city. Our new 2,000,000 gallon water tank is now serviceable. This more than doubles our previous capacity. The construction of the new tank and the accompanying 18-inch waterline were completed on time and within budget. The contractors and city workers did a remarkable job and I thank them for their efforts. To celebrate the construction of our new city hall, we will have a ground breaking ceremony at 5:30 p.m. on March 3, 2011. Come throw some dirt with your elected officials. This city hall will meet the needs of the city for decades to come. It will be a wonderful addition to our city and will set the standard for the beautiful hometown feel of our community.

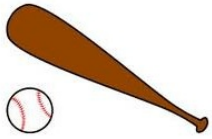

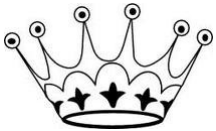

Nibley-Millville First Responders/Squad 140 Report

During 2010, Millville and Nibley Cities experienced 96 medical emergencies within their boundaries. This was another all time high eclipsing the 2008 total of 75 and 2009 record of 92. Of those 96 medical emergencies, 65 occurred in Nibley. Our Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) live in the Millville and Nibley areas and form the first level of response to medical emergencies. We are currently recruiting new members who would be willing to

serve their communities by providing volunteer pre-hospital emergency care. Applicants must hold a current EMT Basic (or Intermediate/Paramedic) certificate from the Utah Bureau of Emergency Medical Services OR be willing to attend and successfully complete an EMT Basic course in Utah. This plan is a cooperative effort between Cache County, Logan City, Nibley City, Wellsville City, Utah State University, Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT), and is intended to create a comprehensive development vision for private and public land along U.S. Highway 89/91 from the mouth of Wellsville Canyon north through southern Logan.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO PREVENT WATER POLLUTION

Dispose of Household Hazardous Waste Properly: Never dump household hazardous waste (such as pesticides, fertilizers, paint, and solvents) into a storm drain, open waterway, or ditch. Storm drains discharge directly to canals and then streams without the benefit of treatment. In addition to posing a threat to our health and environment, such dumping is illegal.



Dispose of Yard Waste Properly: Leaves swept to the curb will not be collected and can clog storm drains. Dumping yard waste into storm drains or waterways is harmful to rivers and is illegal.

Please, Do Not Litter: Trash left along our roadways, ditches, and stream banks washes into our waterways through rain and melting snow. The litter is an eyesore, can endanger wildlife, and will allow stagnant water to breed mosquitoes. Debris can also block drain inlets, preventing efficient drainage.

Maintain Cars and Driveways Properly

- Maintain vehicles to prevent leaking fluids from washing into stormwater.
- Absorb leaks on the driveway with sand or cat litter, then sweep and place in the trash.
- Wash cars at a commercial car wash or over gravel, if possible, to avoid the soapy runoff from entering the storm drains. Car wash businesses are required to dispose of the water through the sanitary sewer system where it will be treated.
- Sweep debris from sidewalks and driveways instead of washing it away with water.
