Updates: Nibley City has hired the engineer to evaluate how to make the intersection at 3200 South safer and better. If you are contacted for input, please share what you think. If you are not contacted but you have something to say, please e-mail me at shaun@nibleycity.com. The more input we can get from citizens the better.

Work has started on the embankment for the bridge on 2600 South. The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) has committed to help with the signaled light and financing of the intersection.

The sewer is constipated. The City Manager and I went down to a meeting in Salt Lake with the board that was going to finance most of the project to build a new sewer treatment plant in Logan (\$70,000,000). Logan presented sunshine and kittens, and we, along with the other Mayors in attendance, respectfully disagreed with that assessment. The Board told Logan to get their act together and come back with a solid agreement with everyone on board. We haven't heard anything since then, so we are working on our own solution set. We are going to make this work, and we will not let Logan tax us without allowing us representation.

Bountiful Baskets is a not-for-profit food co-op for families that want to have more fresh produce for less money. This co-operative is all volunteer with no contracts and so the co-op pays rock bottom prices for their produce. The co-op offers a conventional basket for \$15 which is generally 1/2 fruit and 1/2 vegetables and there is an organic option for \$25—you must bring your own basket or container. Participants make their contributions on the website (www.bountifulbaskets.org) when the website opens on Mondays. The produce is then delivered for pick up at a specified location on the following Saturday. Nibley’s pickup location is 300 West 3200 South; in the yellow brick historic City Hall on the south side of 3200 and next to the park.

Nibley City Tree Board

The Nibley City Tree Board will hold their next meeting on **September 3 at 5:00 p.m.** at City Hall. They will be discussing ways to help Nibley’s Parks Department put more trees in all of Nibley’s City Parks. Blacksmith Fork Wildlife Association

If you plant it, they will come—How do you get songbirds and pollinators to come to your yard? 8 Nibley homeowners, who have certified their property with the National Wildlife Federation, will open their yards for residents to visit on **Saturday, July 26, from 9:00 a.m. to Noon**. This is a free tour sponsored by our volunteer Cache Valley Wildlife Association. Participants who register to certify their property that day will also receive a free tree for their property. If there are extra trees, they will be given away at a free drawing. Join them to see a variety of ways to provide food, water and shelter for our colorful, and helpful, wildlife neighbors. Your participation will also help us make Nibley the first city certified as a wildlife community in Utah. Utility Fees

Starting this month, Nibley City's Storm Water Fee will be going up from \$6.00 to \$6.25 to help keep up with the cost of handling storm water here in the city. Also, the 911 Communications Fee will be going up from \$2.00 to \$3.00 to help pay for the maintenance and replacement of emergency communications equipment. Besides barbecues, hikes, and no school, summer is also a time for weeds and other not so fun yard problems. As a reminder, Nibley City code 4-2 states that weeds over 12" are a nuisance and must be cut. Please keep those pesky weeds under control.
