I was down in Ogden a couple of months ago watching the Mt. Crest kids run at Regionals for Cross Country. I went down to see Hannah, our oldest daughter. She's worked hard this year to go from an occasional jogger to a runner and I wanted to be there for her last race of the year.

After the first lap, her shoe was untied. She had to make a decision—stop and fix the shoe, or keep running and hope for the best. H.E.A.T. PROGRAM

The Home Energy Assistance Target Program began on November 1, 2013. This program assists low income individuals in paying energy bills. An eligible household can apply for only one H.E.A.T payment per winter season. The amount paid is based on type of fuel used, household size, family income, and your energy burden.

To schedule an appointment, call the H.E.A.T. office located at Bear River Association of Governments (170 N Main) in Logan, at 713-1444. The program runs until April 30, 2014 or until federal funds are exhausted.

Dog Licensing

The deadline for licensing dogs for 2014 is March 1. This includes first time applicants as well as renewals. Annual fees are as follows:

- Spayed/neutered—\$15.00
- Unaltered dogs—\$25.00
- Kennel License—\$25.00

A \$10.00 late fee for each dog will be charged after March 1. You can also renew your dog license online by going to www.nibleycity.com. Next click on "Citizens" and then scroll down to "Dog Licensing" and finally, click on "Renew Dog License Online". If you have more than two dogs, a kennel license is required. Call the Nibley City Office if you have questions regarding renewal and/or kennel licenses. Dogs not previously registered with Nibley City must be registered in person at the Nibley City offices. Please bring proof of vaccinations and alteration.

Please be a responsible pet owner. Keeping "man's best friend" licensed with the city can be useful in contacting you and ensuring your pet's safety should your dog ever get loose

Reminders from Nibley City Staff

Hunting or harassing wildlife is forbidden on all City property. Ordinance 13-04 prohibits hunting on property owned by Nibley City and states "Hunting, as defined in §23-13-2, Utah Code Annotated, and which shall include hunting with firearms or with bows, each as defined by the laws of the State of Utah, is from the effective date of this ordinance prohibited on properties owned by Nibley City."

We've had a few snow storms and we would like to pass on a friendly reminder to those who might not have been as attentive as most in keeping sidewalks clear. The Nibley City Code (7-1-2) states that residents are required to remove the snow from their sidewalks within a reasonable time after the snowstorm has ended, which the City has taken to mean within twenty-four (24) hours after the storm is over.

Thank you for all of your efforts in keeping Nibley a well kept and safe place to live.

As in years past, as of **November 1**, the Cache County Sheriff's Department has been enforcing Nibley's winter parking regulations. Nibley City Code, found in section 6-1-4(d). This ordinance keeps our streets clear from obstacles that might hinder our public works department from safely removing snow. A citation may be issued for anyone who violates the ordinance. Please help us keep our streets clear and safe this winter.

Recycling Reminder Program

Now is a great time of year to recycle. With all the wrappings and boxes that come with Christmas, our blue recycling containers should be pretty full and you don't want to miss getting your overflowing container set on the curb on the correct week.

Those who want a reminder of which week to set out recycling cans may sign up at *www.loganutah.org* to receive text or email reminders via the department's website. Once there, click on the recycling symbol at the top of the page and then, using the menu on the left side of the site, click on "collections" and then "recycling reminders."

Emails are sent a few days prior to the collection day, and text messages are sent the day before. Messages will also include reminders about holiday collection schedules, green waste seasons, and other information relevant to garbage, recycling, and green waste collection. Tree Board & Wildlife Association News

Blacksmith Fork Wildlife Association

Get creative and beat the winter blues by participating in the following Blacksmith Fork Wildlife Association sponsored activities:

Bird House Building Contest—now through mid-March. Rules can be picked up at the City Office. It is free and there are awards for several age group categories. The bird houses will be on display at the City Office, then can be sold, taken by the builder, or donated for the Blacksmith Fork Wildlife Association to use in the Nature Center property or in City Parks.

Wildlife Photography Contest—Do you have some interesting or unique photos of Cache Valley wildlife? BFWA contest rules will be available at the Nibley City Office in January.

Nature Parks—The BFWA will be helping to design various nature parks within city limits. All residents are welcome to join with them when they meet on the second Tuesday of each month at City Hall at 7:00 p.m.

Certify your property as wildlife habitat—This is not an anti-hunting movement, but a way to be recognized by the National Wildlife Federation for having food, water and shelter to support birds and pollinators around your home. If Nibley gets 50 homes to certify Nibley will be the only community in Utah recognized by the NWF. Just go to <code>www.nwf.org</code>; click on Wildlife Gardening on the bottom of the page; click on Certify at the top bar on the next page and follow the simple instructions.

Nibley City Tree Board

Once again, Nibley City has met the requirements to be designated as a Tree City, USA community by the National Arbor Day Foundation and are joined with 82 other communities in Utah who earned the same distinction.

The Tree Board is currently working with the Wildlife Association to assist in developing nature parks within the city. Adding more trees to the city and your private property raises land values, as well as providing many health benefits to the community.

WINTER DRIVING SAFETY

The Bear River Health Department has provided a few simple tips to ensure that you have a safe winter while driving.

Prepare by—

- Maintain your vehicle: Check battery and tire tread, check antifreeze, and use fluids that won't freeze.
- Plan your route: Allow plenty of time, be familiar with maps and directions, and let others know your route and arrival time.
- Have on hand: Flashlight, jumper cables, abrasive material (for slippery conditions), shovel, snow brush and ice scraper, warning devices (i.e. flares), and blankets. For long trips, bring plenty of food, water, and medication.
- Stopped or stalled? Stay with your car. Don't over-exert. Put bright markers on antenna or windows and shine dome light. If you run your car, clear exhaust pipe and run engine just long enough to stay warm.
- Practice cold weather driving: During daylight, rehearse maneuvers slowly on the ice or snow in an empty parking lot. Know what your brakes will do. Stomp on anti-lock brakes. Do not pump them. Stopping distances are long on wet and icy roads.

Protect yourself by—

- Wear your seat belt and make sure that all of the passengers in your vehicle are buckled, as well.
- Make sure you use child safety seats properly. Never place a rear-facing infant seat in front of an airbag.
- Children 12 and under are much safer in the back seat. Sit back 10 inches from an air bag.

Prevent crashes by—

- Slow down and increase distances between cars.
- Pay attention for pedestrians walking in the road.
- Remember that drugs, alcohol, and driving do not mix.
- Watch for deer. Brake instead of swerving to maintain control of vehicle.
