Thoughts From Our Mayor

Here's a legislative update on the priority items I've previously discussed.

1. The New High School

We are (hopefully) in the final stages of negotiating the agreement between the school district and the City. We're hoping to have this resolved in the next few weeks.

2. 3200 South and Highway 165

Still working on getting the Request for Proposals ready for qualified consultants. We are working on a new evaluation system so that we can get better value for your dollars, and it's taking some time to get into position.

3. Holding Developers Accountable

Shari Phippen, our City Planner, is working on a new ordinance that will help the City to have more control over development. I'm excited about this because I expect that we will see more building permit requests over the next couple of years, and we need to be prepared and make measures to ensure that Nibley develops responsibly.

4. The Sewer

Not much has changed here. Still working with the other Cities in the valley to try to come up with a fair solution for all of us. I'm optimistic—everyone seems to want to work things out.

Please take a look at the Heritage Days article in this newsletter. You can find information on the city website as well. The Heritage Days committee is working to put together a great, and more compact, program for Nibley's residents this year, and they could really use some help. Specifically the committee is looking for volunteers to help with the Children's Bike Parade and the Fun Run. Neither one has to be professional—we just need a crew that wants to have fun and likes making people smile.

It's Time to Revive Your Green Thumb

Garden Plots are now available for the 2014 planting season at the Nibley Community Garden at the Morgan Farm. Located directly south of Elkhorn park at 770 West 2680 South. Applications are available at Nibley City Hall, the USU Extension office, or on-line at www. tinyurl.com/nibleygarden. Please make checks payable to USU Extension. Checks and applications can be mailed to the USU Extension, 179 N Main Street, #111, Logan, UT 84321. For questions or for more information, call the USU Extension Office at 752-6263 or Bryan Hansen at 245-2168. A general 10' X 20' gardening plot is \$20 or a garden box is \$10. A refundable \$15 cleaning deposit is also required. Additional plots are only an additional \$20 registration per plot. Perma-

nent gardening plots and raised garden beds are also available. An automated sprinkling system is provided at no additional cost. For those demonstrating need, registration fees may be waived partially or in full.

Proposed Cemetery District Changes

The Millville-Nibley Cemetery Special Maintenance District is a maintenance district set up to take care of the cemetery's maintenance and burial duties. It serves most of the residents of Millville and Nibley and those within the district's boundaries are taxed to take pay for these services. The average tax on a home is between \$8.00-\$14.00 per year. As both cities have expanded some residential areas within Millville and Nibley are not in the district's boundaries. What are the advantages of being within the boundaries? Those residents within the boundaries can buy grave lots for \$100.00 as opposed to \$400.00 charged for residents outside the district's boundaries. They can also be buried for \$300.00 as opposed to \$350.00. Residents within boundaries can also take pride in knowing they are helping to maintain one of the prettiest cemetery's in the Cache Valley.

The areas currently outside the district's boundaries but within city limits cannot be annexed into the boundaries without written consent of a percentage of those affected. Those outside of the boundary limits but within Nibley City's boundaries generally live west of 1200 West and North of 3200 South. Please consider this issue carefully. A member of the cemetery board will be contacting those effected in the near future to see if there is enough interest to proceed with annexation procedures.

Whittaker (Ret) received a middle eastern disease while serving in Iraq and was medically retired from the military after 6 years of active service. She now serves as the Family Readiness Group Leader for the Utah Army National Guard 1/145th Field Artillery A-Battery. She also provides counseling and support free of charge for individuals suffering from deployment related PTSD. She is looking forward to serving her fellow citizens in this new capacity.

Bountiful Baskets

Let your dollar stretch further and help your family to eat healthier. Bountiful Baskets is a not-for-profit food co-op for families that want to have more fresh produce for less money.

This as a grass roots co-operative with all volunteer efforts and with no contracts. Because there are no employees at Bountiful Baskets the co-op pays rock bottom prices for their yummy produce. The co-op offers a conventional basket which is generally 1/2 fruit and 1/2 vegetables—you must bring your own basket or container. The monetary contribution is \$15 and generally worth \$50.00 retail. There is an organic option as well which is a \$25 contribution. Participants make their contributions on the bountifulbaskets.org website when the website opens on Mondays. The produce is then delivered for pick up at a specified location on the following Saturday. Nibley's pickup location is 300 West 3200 South; in the yellow brick historic City Hall on the south side of 3200 and next to the park. Volunteer time is 6:54 a.m. and basket pick up time is 7:45 a.m. We encourage you to visit the website now and start enjoying the benefits of fresh fruits and veggies every week.
